

Coronation set to crown new ambassadors

Although there will be no gala for this year's ambassadors, they are still guaranteed to be well-honored and celebrated during the annual patriotic event. Riley Fournier, one of the main organizers of this year's Fourth of July festivities (along with her husband, Alec Fournier) said the gala event is put on by the Annandale Ambassador Program. "It is meant to kick-off our Fourth of July Celebration by bringing the community together for a night of socializing, food, and fun," Fournier said. She said it is also an opportunity for the current Annandale Ambassadors and candidates to connect with the community during the celebration. Unfortunately, this year the gala had to be cancelled due to time, budget and supply constraints with the pandemic, but this will not

dampen the celebration of the ambassadors.

Coronation will take place at 5:30 p.m. Sunday, July 4, at the municipal park. Three candidates will be crowned at the event (one Miss Annandale and two Annandale Princesses). This year there are five candidates vying for these spots.

Since the coronation was cancelled last year, the two ambassadors, Miss Annandale Callie Broughton and Annandale Princess Makena Gunderson, have been reigning for two full years. Fournier said one of the Annandale Princesses that was crowned in 2019 was unfortunately unable to reign for the second year, so there are just two ambassadors this year.

Celebration for many years

Editor's note: Annandale's Fourth of July celebration dates back to 1889 when the first celebration was held. Below are some excerpts of past celebrations from the Annandale Advocate.

Reprinted from the **December 18, 1913 Annandale Advocate**

Annandale's first Fourth of July celebration was held in 1889. The village council and citizens began to plan for a rousing celebration. Nearly all the citizens of the village were on some of the committees and pulled together to make Annandale's first celebration the best in the county. It was proposed by some, and generally agreed to, that the funds remaining after the celebration were to be equally divided between the M. E. church and the Annandale school.

Sen. A.Y. Eaton of Buffalo, and Honorable C.M. King of Fair Haven, were secured as orators of the day. The Kimball brass band was employed to furnish music during the day. There was a general turnout by the surrounding country and neighboring villages. The Annandale celebration passed off as a great success in every respect, and was one of the biggest advertisements for the new, growing village at that time.

July 11, 1901

The rain did not dampen the ardor of the people and the 1,500 visitors that entered the village to assist Annandale in observing the national holiday.

On foot, in wagons, on bicycles, by passenger or freight trains they came, and it seemed that every hamlet and every farm of Wright County was represented.

The procession was formed and marched to the park where a most excellent address was delivered by Rev. Fr. Black, chancellor of the diocese of Portland, Oregon, who was here to lay the corner stone of St. Ignatius church in place of Archbishop Christie as had been announced. During the dinner-hour, rain began to fall and pleasure was at a standstill. When it finally cleared off at 4 o'clock, the grounds were too wet for either players or spectators, and it was decided to put the games and races over to Fri-

July 4, 1907

Today is the day we celebrate. This day Uncle Sam is just 131 years old and the biggest man of his age, or any age, in the world. So let us all have a good time within reason. Let us burn powder, fling the Stars and Stripes to the breeze, see that the kids have sufficiency of fireworks, and take in everything on the program from start to finish, keeping a watchful eye out for fire, and avoid any drinking between drinks. The program contains enough sports of all kinds to give us a glorious day, and let's go into it and enjoy it to the limit, as good American citizens should.

If you enjoy dancing you can find plenty of it. Don't let your patriotism lead you to

toast Uncle's health too often, but just often enough. And don't forget to root for the ball

July 5, 1923

Quite early in the day people came streaming into our fair village to witness the day's program. By nine o'clock, the streets were lined on both sides by cars awaiting the start of the program, the parade.

The parade consisted of floats and decorated cars from several of the more progressive and ambitious business firms and citizens. The parade led to Pleasant Lake Park where a brief program was held. The band opened the program with several selections, which was followed by prayer by the Rev. H.C. Kishpaugh. Rev. W. Hurst read the Declaration of

The singing of "America" by the crowd followed, and then the speaker, Rev. Father O'Brien was introduced. He gave a very appropriate speech, paying a fitting tribute to the nation's heroes. It was rather difficult to speak against the noise of firecrackers and other noises, but Rev. O'Brien was equal to the occasion and the crowd followed him closely.

July 3, 1952

Annandale, a veteran at celebrating the Fourth of July, is prepared this year to offer an anticipated throng of over 20,000 persons a happy time, with a two-day celebration. This event has been planned with an eye toward entertaining the kids as well as the grownups.

Individuals and organiza-

tions have been hard at work since the first of the week preparing floats, building stands, decorating cars, and hundreds of other chores that go into making the event a suc-

July 12, 1973

Thousands attended the Fourth of July celebration in Annandale. The Fourth started out with probably the largest parade in the 84 years of a Fourth of July celebration in Annandale. Sen. Hubert Humphrey was the grand marshal as nearly 100 units participated and the crowd, estimated at 18,000, clapped in approval. People literally were watching from the rooftops on Main Street, and there were many oohs and ahs.

July 8 and 15, 1976

Annandale's 1976 celebration set records. An estimated crowd of over 20,000 watched the big parade in Annandale on the Fourth of July.





The 1.25 mile route will be the same as 2019, starting near the elementary school, heading south of Poplar Ave, traveling down Cherry St, up Oak Ave (Main Street), and then taking one last right onto Park Street before ending.





A Looking back: A timeline of Annandale events

The following are key events dating back to the 1860's in the history of Annandale. Dates and events were gathered from numerous sources including Annandale **Online, the Annandale History** Club, the book Annandale, A Community of Spirit and the Annandale Advocate archives.

1862: Fearing Indians, Annandale settlers built Ft. Harrison (Ft Skedaddle) on the SE shore of Pleasant Lake.

1864: The city's name was changed from Abbyville to Annan-

1869: Annandale's first school, a log cabin, was erected by settlers. **1870:** Grasshoppers decimated crops and many settlers moved away from Annandale.

1872: St. Mark's Episcopal Chapel was built near Clearwater Lake. 1873: St. Ignatius Catholic Church was organized with masses held at the French Lake parish.

1886: The Minneapolis and Pacific Railroad (later the Soo Line) came through Annandale.

The Annandale Post first published a newspaper, later renamed Annandale Advocate.

1887: Annandale Post Office opened. **1888:** Annandale incorporated

with 187 citizens, John Buri was the first Mayor.

A two-story school built on Cedar Ave., across from the present middle school Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church

was erected in Corinna Township. In 1948 the building was moved to Annandale 1889: The first Annandale July 4th

parade was held.

Methodist Church built at the SW corner of Oak and Park. **1890:** Annandale population: 211

St. John's Lutheran Church built on Harrison St W. Dr. Alfred Ridgway M.D arrived in

1919: The Annandale Grain Elevator built and demolished in 2000 Annandale residents vote 92-55 to put in water and sewer.

1958: Zion Lutheran Church built a new church at 360 Chestnut St. Kaz Hardware opened at Oak and Chestnut in the Dunton Hardware building.

Annandale's Jehovah's Witnesses was formed, meeting in homes. 1960: Annandale population: 984 Ferrell Funeral Home at 63 Oak Av

S. opened, now Young and Brown Law Office. 1962: The Annandale Lion's Club was formed.

1964: Camp Friendship opened on Clearwater Lake.

1967: Red Owl opened at the NW corner of Chestnut and Cherry by Marv Marohn.

Veterans from Operation Desert Storm were at the head of the line in the Annandale Fourth of July parade on Thursday. Ted Anderson, David Boxell, Sean Daly, Donald Laney, Carl Olson, Michael Thomas and Dennis Hill Jr. were escorted in military jeeps through the parade as the grand marshals. July 6, 2005

While the floats rolled by on Main Street, Tysann Lundeen of Annandale received and accepted a surprise marriage proposal from boyfriend Dave Forsman. The episode actually started when the Annandale Post Office entry in the parade, a Blue Eagle mascot, left the lineup and delivered an Express Mail envelope and a rose to Tysann. Alyssa Van Lith was crowned Miss Annandale with Alisha Doppenberg and Jenna Carlen being crowned princesses. Megan VanDorp was voted Miss Congeniality. July 11, 2012

The heat was on for this year's Fourth of July activities with the mercury hitting a state record 101 on Independence Day. While the heat reduced the attendance numbers at some events, there were still plenty of devoted participants who braved the temperatures. Riley Bruns was crowned Miss Annandale with Skylar Storkamp and Brianna Tvedt were selected as princesses. Morgan Nicka was chosen by fellow candidates as Miss Congeniality.
